The property is ready for the boys to move in to. The Hutchisons helped to put the final touches in terms of painting the floors and cleaning the kitchen.






The boys will move in on my return to Lesotho in August.

The boys are coping out on the street this winter,



and so far it has not been too cold. We worked with Youth for Christ and the

boys made blankets, and their shelter is watertight and windproof if nothing else.



Kelebohile, who I talked about in last month's newsletter, has gone home! His mum came from Johannesburg, collected him from MIS and took him back to South Africa with her.

Matsebang is doing well and has set up a shop in her garden. She has also got a job with the World Food Programme.





This leaves only two boys under fifteen who will move into our place soon. We will then probably target the boys aged fifteen.

We are preparing for our visit back to Scotland in the middle of July, and Palesa is coming to the end of her school year. Last week she celebrated her fifth birthday.





We also moved house last week, and are now renting a room in a community with eight other volunteers, mostly from New Zealand. It is great until someone locks the whole toilet block so that no-one comes in when they are having a shower! Pray for my patience!!!!
